

New Testament reading – 2 Corinthians 6.1-13

The Day of Salvation

¹As we work together with Christ, we urge you also not to accept the
grace of God in vain. ²For he says,

‘At an acceptable time I have listened to you,
and on a day of salvation I have helped you.’

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! ³We are
putting no obstacle in anyone’s way, so that no fault may be found with
our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in
every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities,
⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶by
purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love,
⁷truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of
righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸in honour and
dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors,
and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and
see — we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet
always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and
yet possessing everything.

¹¹We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to
you. ¹²There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. ¹³In
return — I speak as to children — open wide your hearts also.

Gospel reading – Mark 4.35-41

Jesus Stills a Storm

³⁵When evening had come, Jesus said to his disciples, ‘Let us go across to
the other side.’ ³⁶And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them
in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. ³⁷A great gale
arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already
being swamped. ³⁸But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and
they woke him up and said to him, ‘Teacher, do you not care that we are
perishing?’ ³⁹He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea,
‘Peace! Be still!’ Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. ⁴⁰He
said to them, ‘Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?’ ⁴¹And they
were filled with great awe and said to one another, ‘Who then is this, that
even the wind and the sea obey him?’
