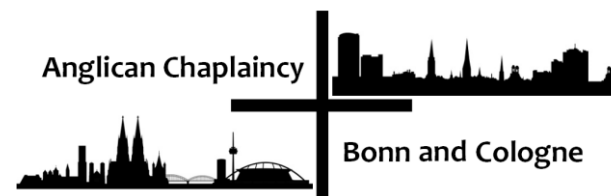

And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'
